HOW CAN KNOWLEDGE TRANSLATION AND IMPLEMENTATION SCIENCE PROMOTE EVIDENCE-BASED, PERSON-CENTRED CARE?



Prof. dr. Alison Kitson is one of the Founders of the International Learning Collaborative. The ILC is dedicated to creating practical resources to ensure that the Fundamentals of Care are visible and valued in every care setting globally. Alison Kitson is the inaugural Vice President and Executive Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences at Flinders University South Australia. Prior to this appointment she was Dean and Head of School at Adelaide Nursing School at the University of Adelaide.



NURSES AS AGENTS FOR PEACE, HEALTH AND SUSTAINABILITY



Dame Anne Marie Rafferty is Professor of Nursing Policy, Deputy Director of the Health and Social Care Workforce Policy Research Unit, former Dean of the Florence Nightingale Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery, King's College London, and President Emerita of the Royal College of Nursing. She is a historian, health workforce and policy researcher. She was elected Member of the European Academy & National Academy of Medicine and Science in the US in 2020.

Theo van Achterberg is a professor of quality of care at the KU Leuven Department of Public Health and Primary Care. Improving the Quality of Healthcare and Implementation of Evidence-informed Practices are key topics in both his research and teaching. Walter's current research focus is on developing computer supported clinical products, with a specific emphasis on applying virtual reality and digital health technology to address difficult problems in behavioral and physical medicine.
